


Breakthrough to Nursing Luncheon

Hurricane Sandy Relief Rockaway Beach, NY

As we all know, Hurricane Sandy devestated many parts of the east coast and many towns are still dealing with its effects. A nursing student at UVA from Rockaway Beach, NY has asked for help rebuilding what Hurricane Sandy violently destroyed. Here is her story:

Dear SON faculty, students and staff, If any of you have watched recent coverage of Hurricane Sandy chances are you have seen or heard of my hometown Rockaway Beach, New York. We are smalltight-knit community in NY's borough of Queens that is actually a Peninsula: Jamaica bay on one side and the Atlantic Ocean on the other. On Monday night, October 29, Rockaway suffered a devastating amount of damage

from hurricane Sandy. The ocean and the bay met one another so that there was not a single square inch of land that was not under water. Houses were lifted from their foundation and rammed in other homes or dropped yards away from the original locations. The boardwalk was completely ripped apart and cars floated away. In addition to this already devastating damage, a huge fire destroyed approximately 140 homes, one of which was my uncle's and another of my cousin's. According to my Dad, they have estimated 1000 homes destroyed and unsalvageable. If home destruction wasn't enough my hometown has reportedly lost four residents to the storm. This has been devastating to every person I know and love and I am struggling daily being so far away from these loved ones. Despite this catastrophe, I know that if there is a community that can get through a tragedy like this it is my hometown. Rockaway is home to the bravest, strongest, and kindest people I know and we will rebuild but we need your help. Sincerely

<u>President:</u> Presides over all meeting; appoints committess; cosigns checks with Treasurer; represents VNSA in matters relating to association.

First Vice President: Assumes the duties of President in the absence/vacancy of the President; responsible for the planning of the Annual Convention.

<u>Second Vice President</u>: Reviews and gives recommedations for the Bylaws; serves as a resource person in the parliamentary procedures; assumes the position of the First Vice President when there is a vacancy.

<u>Secretary:</u> Keeps files and records all minutes; keeps register for roll call of all official delegates; conducts general correspondence for the VNSA as requested.

Treasurer: Acts as custodian of VNSA funds; keeps accurate files and gives reports at Board Meetings.

<u>Legislative Director</u>: Keeps the Board informed of current legislation; educates VMSA constituencies on how to become politically active; serves as representative and attends meetings of the Legislative Coalition of Virginia Nurses.

Breakthrough to Nursing Director: Coordinates activities for general recruitment; advises constituent associations of recruitment affairs and programs.

<u>Director-at-Large:</u> Assists the First Vice President in planning the Annual Convention, assists the Torch editor.

Torch Editor: Responsible for writing, editing, publishing, and distributing the official publications of VNSA, The Torch.

Nominations and Elections Committee Director: Responsible for organizing and running elections at the VNSA Annual State Convention; keeps accurate files and gives reports at the Board Meetings.

Public Relations Director: Responsible for updating and maintaining contest of the VNSA website.

Historian: Collaborate with the Public Relations Director and the Torch Editor pertaining VNSA publications; makes a yearly scrapbook, which will be available for view at the Annual State Convention.
